CHURCH PROFILE

Location

Victor Harbor is a very popular coastal city located just 80 kilometres from the South Australian state capital city of Adelaide. Very much a tourist centre, the resident population of 15,000 will often expand 2 and 3 times in holiday seasons. As a result of its location and weather conditions, the city has a high number of retiring people with the result its demographic shows that over 40% of the population is over 60 years of age. Accompanying this feature is the expanding aged care sector which in turn is seeing a growing younger population arriving to service that industry, along with a growing number of families prepared to commute to the Adelaide regions for work. The Victor Harbor Church of Christ community, numbering 110 in membership, has quite an expansive meeting complex located in Seaview Road very close to the centre of the city. Hence the church's motto is "In the heart of Victor with Victor at heart".

Brief History of the Church

The possibility of establishing a Churches of Christ presence in Victor Harbor was first explored in 1928 and it was not long [1929] before there was a group meeting in the Masonic Hall. With support of the Goolwa and Mount Compass Churches of Christ, ministry was maintained.

In 1940, having travelled through the Depression and now being part of a nation involved in a World War, a small group of near 50, under the innovative leadership of the Rev Bart Manning, were in a position to move into a purpose built, very large

chapel on the Seaview Road site [they had purchased the year before] debt free. 450 people were there to share the occasion and what an amazing achievement for a generous, sacrificial and hard-working group. It was to be 60 years before any alteration or addition was to be considered.

The fruitful era of Sunday School and Christian Youth Fellowship in the 1950's and 1960's saw a strong young church forming that carried ministry operations and growth well into the 1990's, when building modification and expansion of the church's property footprint took place. Through the 1990's and into the first decade of the second millennium, the church staff team was expanded along with the prevailing youth and music ministry. It was in this time that the church membership peaked at over 230.

More Recent History

The last 10 years has seen this Christian community come to face several life tensions that have brought a significant level of fragmentation and consequent loss of momentum in ministry and growth. In 2018, a transition ministry appointment was made with the aim of moving through a season of healing and re-establishing of ministry direction.

During this time, the Church Leadership Team has been intentional in approaching aspects of church life that clearly needed priority attention, which included matters of governance, becoming an incorporated body, administrative framework, property improvements and usage of the complex. In this same time period, genuine attempts were made to re-connect with younger generations, as well as identify some of those other challenges we might face in seeking to build up the body of Christ and extend the Kingdom of God.

The COVID Season

It is a peculiar season this world is moving through and even as South Australia has appreciated a good measure of being 'guarded' from the spreading virus, it is clear to be seen, that life has not quite got the flow it had before early 2020.

That said, the transition process for Victor Harbor Church of Christ has not been halted. The peculiar events going on around have brought into focus some more life matters that we consider will define our future. Some of these include:

- Recognizing the value of developing our technological capacities in order to increase the level of connectedness within the fellowship and into the community around.

- Developing a clearer picture of the style of leadership and ministry appointment needed to facilitate a stronger connect into the younger demographic and between our Churches of Christ communities located on the Fleurieu Peninsula.
- Undertaking a review of current ministry activities to accurately assess effectiveness and sustainability.

Current Church Life Activities

There is a good balance to the many activities in operation within the Victor Harbor Church of Christ. Regular Sunday worship times, several groups orientated to Bible study and fellowship, along with some social type groups, all provide for folk already connected with the church. In turn, there are several gatherings presented in the setting of the church complex, orientated to groups within the wider community, aiming to provide social interaction, as well as relational connection and some introduction to the Christian faith.
