National Youth Ministry Convention

Every 2 years several hundred youth ministry practitioners from across Australia gather together for 3 days to grow in their professional capacity, and in their personal faith. This year it took place at Seaworld Resort on the Gold Coast, from October 9 – 11, and was directed by our very own Carl Milne.

Each day there was a range of electives offered to delegates, ranging from engaging students in schools, basic theology, biblical storytelling, leadership development, understanding trends in Australian youth culture, and supporting at-risk young people. Each night saw everyone gather for worship and to hear from one of the keynote speakers.

This year we took a group of 11 leaders from Churches of Christ here in SA, and were able to greatly subsidise their airfares and conference fee thanks to the generosity of Christian Projects and the Christian Operations Trust.

Over tea each night, as a team we talked about what we were learning, what God was saying to us, and what a highlight had been from that

day. The sense of shared journeying, and being able to encourage each other, and pray together was really significant, and our intent is to keep connecting and exploring what we 'do' with what we have learnt and experienced at NYMC.

I'm greatly encouraged by the calibre and passion of these leaders, and their desire to use what God has shown them, and what they've learnt through their NYMC experience to serve their church communities.

Vanuatu Emergency Update: Returning Home

More than 2,000 evacuees are now back on Ambae exactly one month after the Vanuatu government ordered the total evacuation of over 11,000 people on September 23 for fear of a major volcanic eruption.

Mayble Wilbur, the Education Officer for Conference of Churches of Christ in Vanuatu (CCCV), advised that people are being returned by ship (which only travels during the day) taking them to the west side of the island. People then need to make their own way to the villages. A number of drivers returned so they will be able to drive the trucks to take people home. "We heard from the people returned already on Ambae that all the dogs were waiting for them on the wharf where they left. They were all very happy to see their dogs! The cattle and pigs were gone; chickens were dead unfortunately." (*Santo Ambae Disaster Support Community Facebook*)

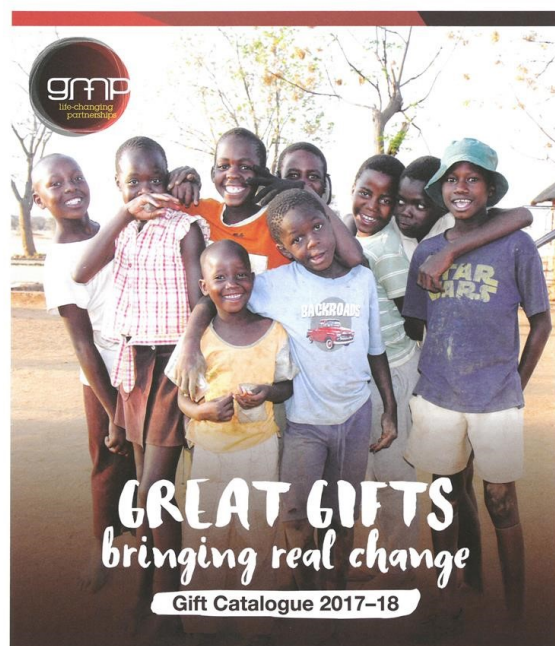
CCCV has been taking calls from people who have returned. The main issue has been about the lack of water, as it has been dry and the water has been contaminated.

"The Chairman of the Disaster Committee of West Ambae told us that the water in their well, water tanks and creeks are acid affected. They can still use the water from the well for the cooking but cannot drink it. There is no drinking water." (*Santo Ambae Disaster Support Community Facebook*)
The people are requesting the government to

help. The Committee has been giving food and water to the people as they are leaving. Other CCCV staffs were at the wharf handing out water and food to the people returning.

It has been raining for the last two days in Santo and also in Ambae, so that may help in washing off some of the volcanic ash. There hasn't been any news about the state of the villages and gardens, but news should be through shortly from families who have just returned.
